MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



The story behind how IGE-SRHR started has always been one that brought in the spirit of consistency, aspiration, and a strong willingness to prove that young people have a voice and are leaders of today.

In 2020, COVID-19 made a negative impression on me. I saw young LBQTI people in Nigeria go hungry, unable to afford medical care, lacking access to funds, and unsure where to turn for assistance. While there were organizations that advocated for LGBQTI people, the needs of younger LBQTI people were not met. As an independent activist at the time, I was able to navigate my own needs but was limited in my ability to extend those needs to other young LBQTI rightsholders. This memory has stayed with me to this day. The decision to advocate for LBQTI rightsholders in a formal setting came after this experience.

Enlighten, watch, network, love, give, receive, settle disputes, and forgive. With these few virtues, it should be possible to create, shape, and cultivate small miracles with great impact, and finally overcome major obstacles in order to advocate for young LBQTI rightsholders in Nigeria in a sustainable manner!

In 2021, the operational focus was on building infrastructure, training a team, and project work in Nigeria. IGE-SRHR's sole mission is to support LBQTI rightsholders in Nigeria, particularly in the North Central and South-South states. I subsequently concluded to deal more intensively with improving the standard of living of young LBQTI persons and predominantly concerned with the question of what is needed to improve their quality of life in these selective zones.

IGE-SRHR now pursues this goal in a variety of ways. We subdivide our projects into five different thematic areas: Health, Empowerment, Technology for Development, Safety and Security, Human Rights. It is extremely important to us to realize projects in harmony with the context of the Nigerian traditional norms and values, religion, and ideas of the locale, because my preferred mantra and credo remain one of sustainability. Although this fashionable term has already been embraced by many, and repeated a thousand times, few people are conscious

of how sustainability describes a concrete principle for action in the efficient use of resources. Sustainable development is, however, only possible if all parties involved work closely together and have the same goal in mind.

This leads me to another important point: our team. Large goals can only be achieved together, which is why I am convinced that networking is indispensable. Contacts have been established not only in the North Central states, but also in the South Central states. I have already set up respectable teams in both North Central and South-South in order to implement challenging and extensive projects with these outstanding and loyal co-workers.

In order to be able to meet the basic needs of our rightsholders, the following questions arise: How can young LBQTI people become more independent and get access to resources and services related to health care, education on sexual health and reproductive rights, job skills, and an understanding of their basic human rights? What services can IGE-SRHR provide to LBQTI persons in Nigeria? How does IGE-SRHR intend to promote gender equality and sexual and reproductive health for marginalized communities? In seeking the answer, the frequently raised query regarding the name of our organization becomes self-evident. In the long run, I see IGE-SRHR as a social enterprise that will serve as a stepping stone for young LBQTI people in Nigeria to self-actualize.

I would like to draw the attention of our donors, partners, and friends to certain things that, in my view, are mission-critical for delivering our mission. We at IGE-SRHR want to motivate our rightsholders to actively participate in the design of our projects and to create a future that can make everyone happy in the long term.

ORGANIZATION



WHO WE ARE

Initiative for Gender Equality and Sexual Reproductive Health (IGE-SRH) is a sub-national, youth-led organization founded in 2020 whose primary focus is the protection, promotion, and fulfillment of the rights, meaningful inclusion, and programming of young LBQTI rightsholders in Nigeria who have been systematically discriminated against because of their sexual orientation, gender identity, expression, and sexual characteristics.

VISION STATEMENT

We envision a world where young sexual minorities are free from discrimination and persecution and have equal opportunities in life.

MISSION STATEMENT

We strive to ensure young LBQTI individuals are engaged in meaningful decision-making processes through advocacy, knowledge generation, information sharing, partnerships, and capacity building.



HOW WE OPERATE

Since 2020, we have been programming and implementing projects for our rightsholders to improve their knowledge in advocacy, education on sexual health, and empowerment through technology to enhance their skills for the long term.

We have been implementing projects in the north-central and south-south zones of Nigeria. In addition to this clear geographical focus, we limit our activities to five thematic areas where we can have the most impact on our rightsholders:

1. Health (SRHR, HIV and AIDS, STI treatment, and safe abortion services),
2. Technology for development,
3. Safety and security,
4. Human rights, and
5. Empowerment.

IGE-SRH is living the notion of “Help for Self-help” - our projects empower our rightsholders to improve their standard of living from Know-How to Do-How.

In April 2022, IGE-SRH recruited its first sets of team members to drive and build the structure of the organization. By December, we had a tremendous growth of 6 staff and 3 volunteers. The team continues to grow steadily, and in order to successfully implement our projects in the future, we are dependent on our growing, loyal team.

We work with a group of young, vibrant people who tirelessly ensure we execute our mandate as an organization.

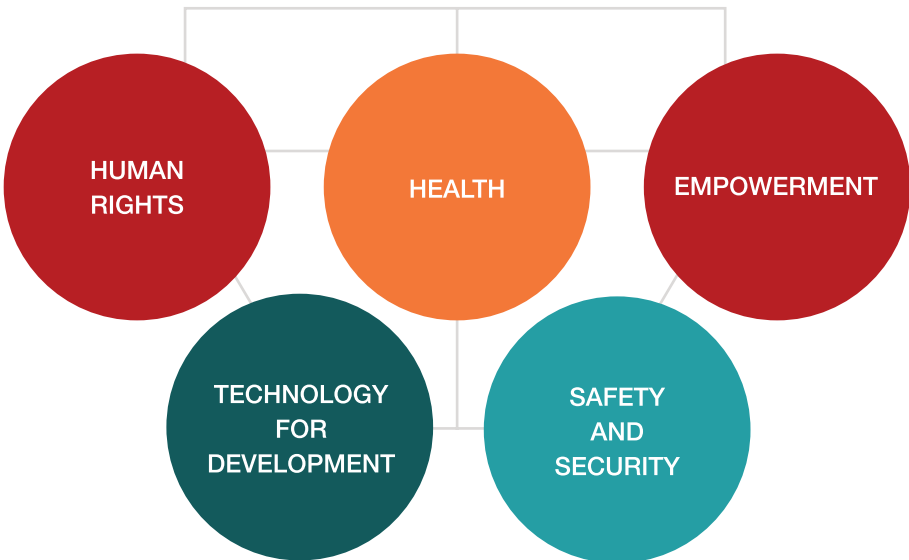
I also work with the Executive Director and other key staff to coordinate the operations and implementation of project activities and all financial implementations of activity for the project.

IGE-SRH, supported by the Power of Pride/COC Nederland, kicked off the year by consulting LBQTI rightsholders in Akwa Ibom and Cross River States, aimed at discovering and understanding a wide range of prevalent challenges faced by LBQTI persons in the South-South zone in Nigeria. This project produced an SRHR policy brief to guide advocacy for young LBQTI people in Nigeria.

IGE-SRH hosted The Power of Pride 2022 Nigerian Partners to discuss their experiences, challenges, and expectations for 2023.

In June, IGE-SRH made a documentary with the support of the Civicus Alliance. It showed the LBQTI Human Rights Defenders as they talked about their passion, commitment, and problems while fighting for the rights of the LBQTI community in Nigeria. This was to create awareness of the struggles of human rights defenders and, by extension, the LBQTI community in Nigeria.

IGE-SRH was represented at the 73rd Ordinary Session of the African Commission and the 40th African Human Rights Book Fair in Banjul, Gambia. As our mandate, IGE-SRH is bridging the gap for young LBQTI rightsholders to have meaningful engagement in regional human rights advocacy processes.

ISDAO supported IGE-SRH with funding to strengthen the capacity of the organisation. IGE-SRH was able to strengthen its organizational capacity and develop relevant organizational policies and documents.

HEALTH



SRHR, HIV/AIDS, MENTAL HEALTH

In July 2022, IGE-SRH started a "Zero New HIV Infection" National Accountability Project funded by Frontline AIDS. The project was aimed at generating accountability for HIV prevention. It also was to support coordinating different key population groups and stakeholders in engaging with the new Global HIV Prevention Roadmap for 2022 - 2025. IGE-SRH successfully developed a 2022 milestone draft and recommended accountability measures to guide HIV prevention for Key Populations till 2025.

IGE-SRH started the "Ripple Effect" SRHR advocacy project, funded by Urgent Action Fund Africa. The goal of this project was to give young LBQTI rightsholders more options for getting SRHR services and living healthy lives. The project produced a 3-year action plan for programming for the LBQTI community in Nigeria.

With the support of HIVOS, IGE-SRH as an organization is leading as one of the communities of action in providing and prioritizing SRHR needs and services for the LBQTI community in the South-South zone. Through the Free to Be Me and WeLead projects, we are ensuring that LBQTI rightsholders are educated on their sexual rights and have access to healthcare services.

IGE-SRH also prioritizes mental healthcare for our rightsholders. We collaborated with The Beyond Infinity Initiative on discovering, understanding, and evaluating the mental health needs for LBQTI rightsholders in the South-South zone.

OUR PARTNERSHIP APPROACH

We believe that the way we work sets us apart from others in our field. This is due to our partnership approach, which is hands-on, in-depth, and participatory. Our project team is constantly involved at every level of our projects' implementation, and we strive to help our partners grow throughout the process. We seek to build long-standing, close relationships with local partners founded on trust, equal partnership, and local ownership.



IGE-SRH is a member of the Multistakeholder Leadership Group as one of the youth-led organizations to advise and support decision-making for the Generation Equality Initiative for the next four years.



In partnership with Alliance for Africa, IGE-SRH contributed to the drafting of the Nigeria's Shadow Report, for submission to The Protocol to the African Charter on Human and People's Rights (ACHPR) on the Rights of Women in Africa (Maputo Protocol).



IGE-SRH was represented at the meeting with the Independent Expert on the enjoyment of all rights by older persons. The consultation highlighted issues affecting LGBTQI older persons in Nigeria while providing recommendations.

- IGE-SRH co-Hosted the African Pride Accelerated (APA) 2022 Conference, in partnership with Women's Health and Equal Rights (WHER), Creme De La Creme House of Fame Foundation, Center For Health Education And Vulnerable Support (CHEVS), Women's Initiative For Sustainable Empowerment And Equality (WISE), Improved Sexual Health And Rights Advocacy Initiative, Wave Makers Initiative, Equality Triangle Initiative, Intersex Nigeria. Aimed at connecting, sharing experiences, find camaraderie.



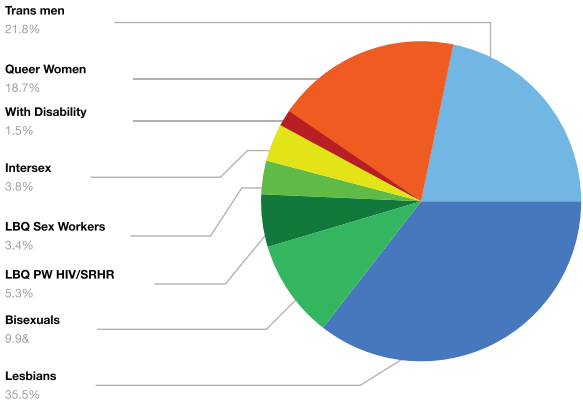
- With the support of ISDAO, IGE-SRH is part of a consortium in the CHEVS-hosted Free & Equal project, which aims to challenge human rights violations against LGBTQI people, Sex Workers, and PWUD in Nigeria.
- IGE-SRH is partnering with Connected Development on economic development for LBQTI rightsholders in the North-Central and South-South zone. IGE-SRH sees economic development beyond training and educating our rightsholders. We have futuristic plans to ensure our rightsholders are placed in empowerment and financial schemes
- IGE-SRH hosted The Power of Pride 2022 Nigerian Partners to discuss their experiences, challenges, and expectations for 2023.
- IGE-SRH made a courtesy visit to PanAfrican ILGA on matters of interest to our rightsholders. Moving forward, IGE-SRH is intentional with collaborations and connections for the benefit of our rightsholders.



IGE-SRHH 2022 REACH

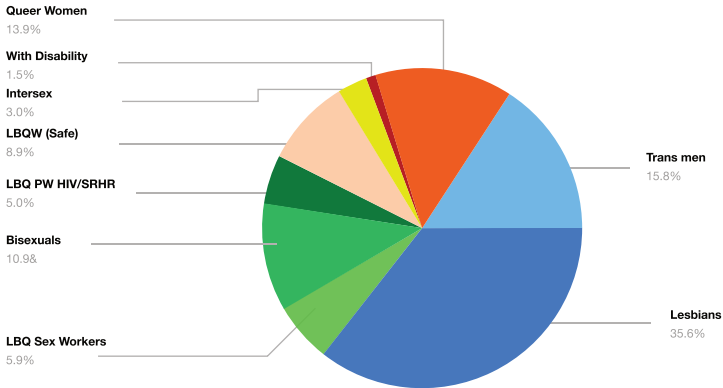

PERCENTAGE OF RIGHTSHOLDERS REACHED

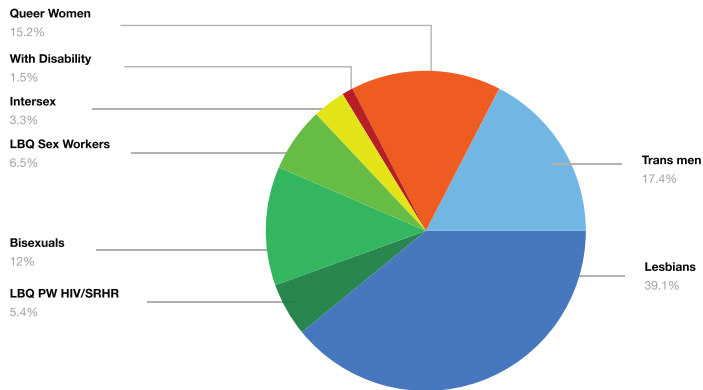


The figure on the left gives an overview of our outreach in 2022. Overall, we reached over 300 people with our programs and activities in our catchment areas. Our highest reach is to lesbians, which represented 35.5% of the people who were reached by our activities.

NORTH-CENTRAL RIGHTSHOLDERS (FIG 1)

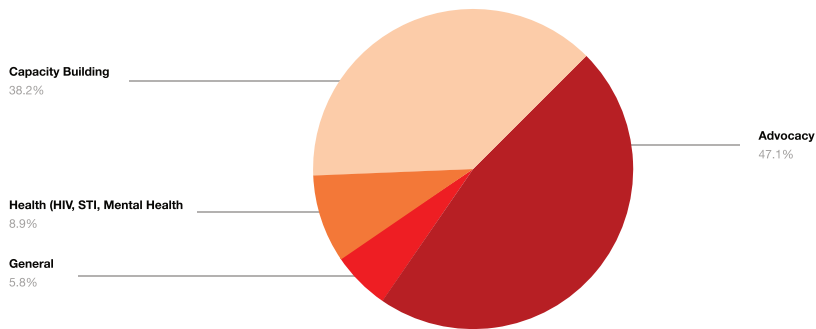


SOUTH-SOUTH RIGHTSHOLDERS (FIG 2)



The figures (Fig 1 and Fig 2) above show the exact percentage of the number of rightholders reached in the two regions we implement.

THEMATIC AREAS



The figure above shows how the organization's resources, efforts, and results are spread out among our thematic areas. The chart is divided into several slices, each representing a portion corresponding to a specific theme.

This most prominent theme, accounting for 47.1%, indicates that the organization's resources and efforts are directed toward improving advocacy. While the second largest slice, accounting for 38.2% of the total, is towards increasing the capacity of our rightsholders. This theme focuses on promoting education and training initiatives among communities.

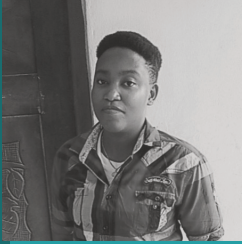
The remaining pieces are dedicated to the themes of "Health (HIV, STI)" (8.9%) and "General" (5.8%). These themes demonstrate the organization's focus on promoting overall health and well-being, while also for future generations.

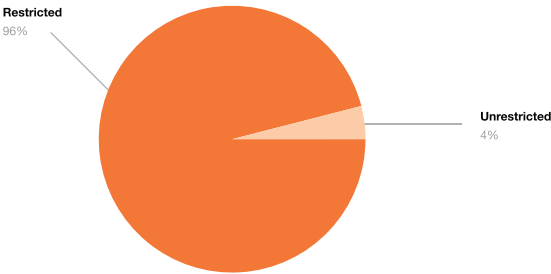
2022 INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

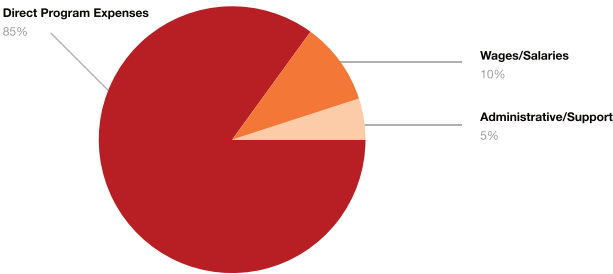
2022 GRANT INCOME



EXPENDITURE BREAKDOWN

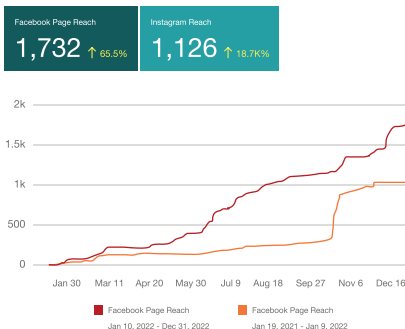

2022 GRANT INCOME

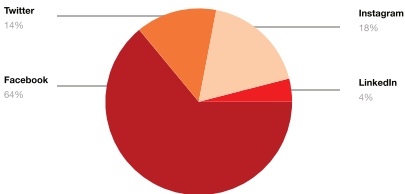


SOCIAL MEDIA ANALYSIS

In 2022, we reached 2,858 people through our social media platforms. This demonstrates the potency of using social media to connect and stay connected with our target audience.

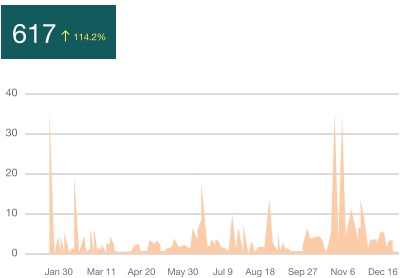


In 2022, we had 1488 visitors on our social media platforms. This increase in traffic is a positive indicator of the growing interest in our organization by our target audience.

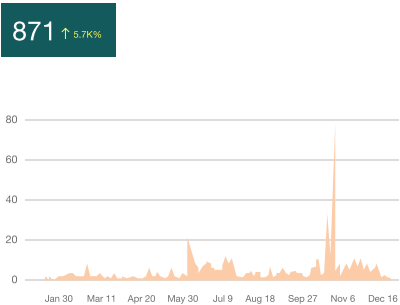
